## **Ride Restrictions**

This guide contains extra information that may be relevant to guests with additional needs or disabilities, inclusive with our general ride restrictions (including height, size and loose item restrictions) that are applicable to all guests. These are detailed on information boards at the entrance of each ride queue, and it is the responsibility of all guests to check these before deciding to ride.

Several rides are unsuitable for guests with heart, neck, or back conditions, or if you are pregnant, and we strongly recommend that guests who have had recent surgery or an injury do not ride certain attractions.

All rides require guests to keep their arms and legs inside the ride carriages, and remain seated at all times.

Not all rides are suitable for all guests. Each ride has strict operating requirements that all riders must meet. As well as taking note of the ride restrictions, we strongly suggest that you watch our rides in motion before making a decision on whether to ride.

If you have a visual impairment, it is your responsibility to assess the ride and potential risks before riding. Please speak to a rides supervisor if you have any questions related to your particular needs.

If you need assistance with lifts, stairs or anything else during your day, please speak to a member of our team.
